



Library Resources

As a member of the Bay Area community, you have access to many libraries and their on-line/print resources. For some libraries, in order to access full text articles from online journals and databases, you will need to go to the actual library. From there, you can search databases, download articles to the library's computer, and print them for a minimal fee. Several libraries also offer free cards that allow you to check out books. Below is a brief synopsis of some Bay Area library systems.

Summary	The UC library system is one of the most extensive print and online collections in the country. Offers a free library card and access to professional librarians and educators. If your item is not available via LINK+ , you can request it through ILL, which is connected to UC campus libraries, libraries throughout California, the United States, and Canada. A non-refundable \$2 is charged for an ILL request.	Order books from other libraries via Interlibrary Loan (ILL) . Patrons will be charged \$4 for placing each ILL request, even if we are unable to obtain the item.
